Together we can advance knowledge about this keystone species.

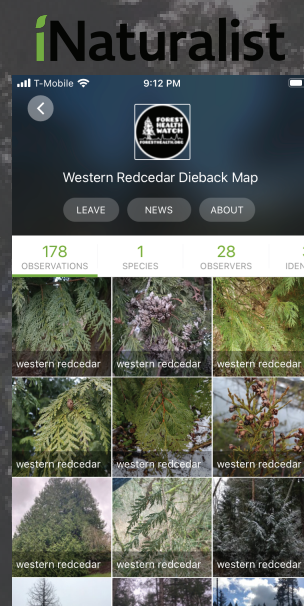
